## 33. Resume of the institution

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Brief appraisal of the overall performance of the institution during the preceding academic session and plans for future development may be given.

Dr. Sivanthi Aditanar College of Physical Education was established in September 1993 and is 3 km from the Temple Town of Tiruchendur on Tiruchendur – Tirunelveli road.
